



MUSIC ACTION PLAN 2018/2019

Key outcomes:

- The Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 statutory Music curriculum is in place
- Children are engaged and immersed in music and enjoy working as individuals and as a team to make good quality music
- Music is a more integral part of the school

Overall priorities:

- To develop children's knowledge and understanding of the history of music, world music and great musical composers
- To link music to other subjects, topic areas and projects within the school
- To improve the quality of singing across the school
- To increase the number of children choosing to play an orchestral/band instrument
- To provide opportunities for children to choose Music as an extra-curricular activity
- To add variety to enrichment activities and increase the number of opportunities to perform e.g. singing within the community, performing at live events, taking part in activities at other schools.

Key actions:

- Timetable music across the school as per the SLA with Staffordshire Performing Arts
- Introduce musical games and songs to class teaching
- Use 'Sing up' to encourage children to sing more widely/learn new songs
- Provide opportunities to share music, information and material with others
- Schedule key events across the academic year to showcase music and enable children to perform
- Create a timeline to show pieces studied by the great composers in the context of time
- Start a KS2 after school Orchestra
- Start an after school Choir

- To organise and utilise all music resources
- To purchase a music instrument trolley
- To purchase two sets of boom whackers
- To play and explore the sound qualities of the djembes
